Romain Seil

Professor Seil studied medicine in Luxembourg and Brussels. He trained in Belgium and Germany. He received his diploma in Orthopaedic Surgery in 1998 and of Special Orthopaedic Surgery in 2001 by the Medical Association of Saarland / Germany. He wrote his doctoral thesis on meniscal repair in 2001 and his professoral thesis (habilitation) on pediatric anterior cruciate ligament injuries in 2003.

Professor Seil works as an orthopaedic surgeon at the Centre Hospitalier de Luxembourg since September 2004 where he is Head of the Department of the Locomotor system. His main areas of clinical activity are orthopaedic sports medicine as well as primary and revision knee reconstructive surgery. He was appointed extraordinary professor in orthopaedic surgery at the University of Saarland in 2007. Prof. Seil is co-director of the Luxembourg Olympic Medical Centre and of the Sports Medicine Research Laboratory of the "Luxembourg Institute of Health".

His scientific work deals with the analysis and improvement of diagnostic, surgical and non-surgical principles of overuse and sports-related joint injuries and diseases as well as on the investigation and promotion of primary and secondary prevention initiatives in sports medicine and joint surgery. Prof. Seil is a founding member and serves as board of trustee's member of the Journal of Experimental Orthopaedics, the basic science journal of the ESSKA. He is co-editor of the journals "Arthroskopie" (official journal of the German-speaking Arthroscopy Association AGA) and Sports Orthopaedics and Traumatology (official journal of the GOTS) as well as editorial board member and reviewer of several scientific journals in orthopaedic surgery and sports medicine. He authored and co-authored numerous peer-reviewed publications and book chapters and was selected as featured author of the month August 2015 in the American Journal of Sports Medicine.

Professor Seil is fellow of the American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine since 2001 and member of many national and international medical professional societies. He is currently President of the European Society of Sports Traumatology, Knee Surgery and Arthroscopy (ESSKA), as well as Incoming President of the German-speaking Society in Orthopaedic and Traumatologic Sports Medicine (GOTS). From 2003 until 2005, he was chairman of the arthroscopy committee of the International Society of Arthroscopy, Knee Surgery and Orthopaedic Sports Medicine (ISAKOS). In 2014 he was president of the Annual Meeting of the French Arthroscopy Society in Luxembourg and in 2016 he has been president of the Annual Meeting of the GOTS in Munich.
